

## ***It Seemed Like Nonsense!***

### **The Resurrection Story**

<sup>1</sup>“On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup>They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup>but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup>While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup>In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, “Why do you look for the living among the dead?” <sup>6</sup>He is not here; He has risen! Remember how He told you, while He was still with you in Galilee: <sup>7</sup>“The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.”” <sup>8</sup>Then they remembered His words.

<sup>9</sup>When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. <sup>10</sup>It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. <sup>11</sup>But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. <sup>12</sup>Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.” - Luke 24:1-12

### **Some Truisms About Human Nature**

- People tend to see what they want to see.
- The power of suggestion is tremendous.
- When you see something you don’t expect to see, it has a greater impact on you!

“He will be handed over to the Gentiles. ### **A Few Thoughts About Those Who Went to the Tomb**

*Note that all three groups/people went in unbelief!*

#### **A. The women were not expecting a risen Christ.**

1. They left early in the morning on the first day of the week.

3. They were only looking for Jesus’ body.

“They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup>but when they entered, **they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.**” - Luke 24:2,3

4. They were wondering about this.

“**While they were wondering about this**, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them.” - Luke 24:4

“Woman,” Jesus said, “why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?” Thinking He was the gardener, she said, “Sir, if you have carried Him away, **tell me where you have put Him**, and I will get Him.” - John 20:15

### **B. The Disciples were not expecting anything.**

1. They thought the women’s report was nonsense.

“But they did not believe the women, because **their words seemed to them like nonsense.**” - Luke 24:11

2. They (except Peter & John) didn’t even go to the tomb.

“Peter, **however**, got up and ran to the tomb.” - Luke 24:12

### **C. Simon Peter didn’t know what to expect.**

“...he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.” - Luke 24:12

“So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. <sup>4</sup>Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. <sup>5</sup>He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. <sup>6</sup>Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, <sup>7</sup>as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus’ head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. <sup>8</sup>Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. <sup>9</sup>(They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)” - John 20:3-9

### **What Do We Learn?**

- When you see something you don’t expect, it can have a tremendous personal impact on you.
- When you see something you don’t expect, it can have more validity to it.
- Just because you don’t believe something, doesn’t make it untrue.
- If Jesus did rise from the dead, He is our Messiah, our God, and to reject Him would be absolutely foolish.
