"What you are about to do, do quickly," Jesus told him, <sup>28</sup>but no one at the meal understood why Jesus said this to him. <sup>29</sup>Since Judas had charge of the money, some thought Jesus was telling him to buy what was needed for the Feast, or to give something to the poor. <sup>30</sup>As soon as Judas had taken the bread, he went out. And it was night."

## The Public Affirmation

Jesus had just told the disciples that they could be happy if they would serve others. But there is one exception among them.

"Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them. <sup>18</sup> "I am not referring to all of you..." - John 13:17,18

"I am not referring to all of you; I know those I have chosen." - John 13:18 "Yet there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray Him." - John 6:64

- God didn't make Judas evil, but He used the evil in Judas' heart.
- Judas was the epitome of evil.
- The work of Judas was foretold in the Scriptures. (v. 18)

#### The Painful Announcement

The disciples had no idea as to the identity of the betrayer. *"His disciples stared at one another, at a loss to know which of them He meant."* - John 13:22

At Peter's request, John asked Jesus who the betrayer was. Jesus gave a clear signal, but no one seemed to catch it.

# **The Private Appeal**

Jesus signaled Judas that He knew what was in his heart.
